WHAT WE BELIEVE: SURVEY OF CHRISTIAN BELIEFS

CHRISTIAN COUNSELLING: BRAIN & BEHAVIOUR

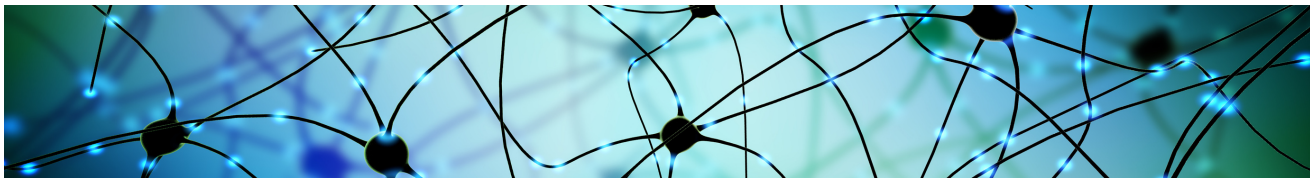
CNS 245
